

## ADVERTISEMENT AND INVITATION FOR BIDS

Sealed Bids for the construction of the San Jacinto County, Texas – Hurricane Harvey Round 1 will be received by San Jacinto County, Texas at 1 State Hwy 150, Room 23, the Office of the County Judge, Coldspring, Texas 77331, until 11:00 am local time on Wednesday, April 21, 2021, at which time the Bids received will be publicly opened and read aloud immediately thereafter in the San Jacinto County Commissioners' Court.

There will be a non-mandatory pre-bid conference with the Engineer, Owner, and Prospective Bidders at 10:00 am on Thursday, April 8, 2021 at the San Jacinto County Commissioners' Court.

The Project provides for roadway improvements on Morris Creek Road, North/South Butch Arthur Road, Ellis Lovett Road, and Jenette Lane totaling approximately 38,198 linear feet of roadway as well as 81 LF of 42" culvert and 200 LF of 72" culvert with a grate inlet junction box on Waterwood Parkway. Bids are for several items and quantity of work as follows:

1. Mobilization
2. Base improvements including pulverizing, regrading, shaping and compacting
3. Construction of flexible base, placing, and compacting
4. Construction of asphaltic paving
5. Storm culvert replacements
6. Roadside ditch shaping and grading
7. Driveway and intersection turnout improvements

Bidding Documents are on file at <https://bids.lja.com>. There is no cost to view the plans, and printing can be done through the website. Hard copies of Bidding Documents will not be sold. Complete sets of Bidding Documents shall be used in preparing Bids; neither Owner nor Engineer assumes any responsibility for errors or misinterpretations resulting from the use of incomplete sets of Bidding Documents. Owner and Engineer, in making copies of Bidding Documents available on the above terms, do so only for the purpose of obtaining Bids for the Work and do not confer a license or grant for any other purpose.

A bid bond in the amount of 5 percent of the bid issued by an acceptable surety shall be submitted with each bid. A certified check or bank draft payable to San Jacinto County, Texas or negotiable U.S. Government Bonds (as par value) may be submitted in lieu of the Bid Bond.

This project will be financed with assistance from the General Land Office (GLO) under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program and is subject to all applicable Federal and State laws and regulations. Attention is called to the fact that not less than, the federally determined prevailing (Davis-Bacon and Related Acts) wage rate, as issued by the Texas General Land Office, Disaster Recovery and contained in the contract documents, must be paid on this project. In addition, the successful bidder must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual identity, gender identity, or national origin.

San Jacinto County, Texas reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to waive any informalities in the bidding. Bids may be held by San Jacinto County, Texas for a period not to exceed 60 days from the date of the bid opening for the purpose of reviewing the bids and investigating the bidder's qualifications prior to the contract award.

All contractors/subcontractors whose System for Award Management (SAM.gov) registration is not active or that are debarred, suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation on federal assistance programs may not undertake any activity in part or in full under this project.
